

Workers news from Iran

TEHRAN

On 20th of November 2005, hundreds workers gathered in front of the parliament of the regime in city of TEHRAN. They protested regarding to anti-workers' rules and temporary agreements. Those labours asked for cancelling these agreements.

According to the Islamic regime work rules conventional workers have been deprived from all benefits of unemployment insurance!

KHOZESTAN'S BAG COMPANY

On Sunday morning - 20th of November 2005, tens labours gathered in front of governor's office. They took exception as compared with employers' acts, because not only employers have closed their company but also they have not paid wages to their employees for two months. The objector workers brought to an end their gathering when the regime responsible(s) promised to investigate workers' problems.

PLIM'S COMPANY IN EYLAM

40 workers of this company were fired out. Should say discharged workers have not received their wages too. Those workers reported their difficulties with employers to the department of labour.

SOUTH WEAVING COMPANY

On 14th of November 2005, about 50 discharged workers of the above-named company protested in front of governor's office of YAZD province. The protester workers solicited to return to work.

FERNAKH & MAHNAKH COMPANY

On 15th of November, 2005 thousand workers protested in front of the parliament in capital of IRAN. In the course of one month those workers have gathered four times but the government has not taken any necessary action for dissolving workers' problems.

CITY OF SARAKHS

In conformity with received news discharged workers of SARAKHS GAS COMPANY gathered in front of governor's office of this city on 15th of November 2005. Each of them Has more than 20 years service. Those workers and their families have protested in front of governor's office several times, but until now no action took place by governor.

DEZFOL'S CUBE SUGAR FACTORY

On Wednesday morning 16th of November 2005, workers of this factory gathered in front of governor's office. This factory was transferred to private section in 2003. From that time the above-named factory has been shut down and its workers' wages have not been paid until now. Those workers have protested in front of the government departments several times but nobody has investigated to their claims.

LURISTAN

The fact that workers of LURISTAN'S refrigerator factory have protested in front of the Islamic regime organizations many times and they have requested employers to dissolve their problems, but nobody pays attentions. When this factory was transferred to private section, 3 hundred workers of it were fired out. These workers have not received their wages since 2004.

TABBAS

Workers of TABBAS HOSPITAL protested with regard to unpaid wages in front of workers' house. Employers of the above-mentioned hospital have not paid labors' wages for five months. In spite of workers' protests, employers and responsible(s) do not take necessary actions. Must say whole workers of service companies have same situation in city of TABBS.

KERMAN PROVINCE

On the basis of received news a workers in the name of MOHAMMAD KHOSRAVI lost his life as the result of an accident at work place. Hundreds workers lose their lives at work places every year in IRAN.

KURDISTAN'S WEAVING FACTORY

On Saturday 19th of November 2005, the workers' strike of the above-named factory was finished after 57 days and workers reached victory.

Accepted claims are as follow:

- 1- Return of 36 discharged workers to work.**
- 2- Collective conclusion for 193 of conventional workers.**
- 3- Do plan of classification of vocations.**
- 4- Pay wages which is related to the strike days.**

5- Employer must pay right of insurance in the days of the strike.

CENTRAL PROVINCE

Employers of the biggest mine in central province have made very bad conditions for their workers. BER-O-NER COMPANY which is employer of this mine has not paid wages to its employees 75 days. Workers have protested for their unpaid wages several times.
